

Treasurer's Report to Annual General Meeting 22nd April 2023

Receipts for 2O22/23 financial year totalled \$9936.80 up from \$8469.40 last year Payments totalled \$8803.89 up from \$6119.69 last year resulting in a surplus of \$1132.91 for the year: This is a pleasing result following deficits in recent years.



The Profit & Loss table below summarises major areas of Expenditure and income.

The cost of library utilities was down by \$310.71 on the previous year.

Admin and ILMO were also down slightly.

Income from membership subscriptions and donations was up \$694.50 but this varies each year depending on subscriptions being paid before or after March 31. As at 21 April 2023, 55 Mersey Branch members were financial for /24 year, including four new members. Financial members in November 2022, 74. Membership continues to decline, 83, 96, 83, 79, 74 are numbers for last five years. Income from membership last year is shown in table below.

Research income was well up on the previous year, an increase of \$1184.32. Well done to Ros and all those members involved in research.

The library made a small surplus despite the cost of carpet cleaning, painting and new lighting installed during the Christmas break.

The Christmas Raffle and an Afternoon Tea/Trade Table held in February were both successful resulting in an increase of \$1178.95 in fund-raising income.

Sales income was up again this year.

A new hard drive and guillotine were purchased during the year. One library computer is not functioning correctly and investment in replacement computer hardware and operating system will be required in the near future in order that we can continue to offer reliable computer access to members and visitors.

Since the library reopened after the outbreak of Covid the number of people using the library has gradually increased. The number of members using the library this financial year is on a par with last year's figures with three members using the resources on a regular basis: Gloria Bowden has a regular booking for using



Publication Report to Annual General Meeting 23rd April 2003

I make this report to the members present with some degree of trepidation as I neither sort nor was appointed as Mersey Branch's Co-ordinator of, in fact I became the pseudo appointee for the past twelve months.

Throughout the period I have had considerable health problems have been unable to perform the duties as coordinator. It is with gratitude that I received the understanding and support from fellow volunteers. I thank President Ros and Gaye Hays for



The scanning of the Personal Classified pages from the Advocate Newspaper continues.

Sandra Henwood now collects the Classified pages from the Advocate Newspaper and in future, will, be responsible for scanning and copying these sheets, thus preparing the data for indexing. Special thanks to Sandra, Anne Lowe and Lyn Chambers all of whom prepare the data for final publication.

Completion of the indexing of all Classified pages for the years from 2016 to 2020 made it possible to produce a new publication entitled "An Index to the Classified Pages of the Advocate Newspaper 2016 -2020". As the year 2015 had not been produced in book form it left it open for the production of a second 5-year-book covering the years from 2011 to 2015. Both books are now in circulation. The Archives Authorities advised us that the 2006 single year Advocate book had not been published - this has now been rectified.

Our 3-fold brochure has been updated. Similarly, our Sales Brochure continues to be updated as required. I thank Gaye Hays.

The ILMO newsletter continues to be compiled quarterly and distributed to all members via email or postage. My aim was to produce a newsletter that contains items of interest – some serious and others with an element of humour. I firmly believe that the newsletter should be something other than an avenue for the publishing of sales specials for the reminding members of coming events. Our committee members have contributed interesting articles that have been used and I sincerely thank them.

Following an article which appeared in an Interstate Newsletter the Committee agreed to make Gift Voucher Certificates available to persons wishing the give a present to family or friends. They can be used for research, certificates, book purchases and memberships. To date the response has been minimal.

There remains two other projects which I have been unable to conclude within my period of Publications Coordinator. The production of the Mersey Vale Cemetery Book, in some form, probably without images of plaques. In 2016/17, I personally spent many hours photographing all of the plaques found on plinths. I believe these photographs should not be lost and intend to hand them to the Branch for research or future publication purposes.

The revised version of "The Cemetery That Was", will be available with the next few months as arrangements are now in play to obtain the approval to publish and print.

As this will be my last and final report as Publication Co-Ordinator, I wish to convey my sincere thanks to each and everyone, from within Mersey Branch and its Membership, for their support, advice, assistance and fellowship during the last thirteen years.


